# Flowing Forward: \$18.6 Million Boost Secures Longreach's Water Future

Council is proud to announce a significant milestone in our ongoing efforts to secure the future of our community's water supply.

As part of the Water Infrastructure for Sustainable and Efficient Regions (WISER) initiative, \$18.6 million of funding to upgrade to our water infrastructure has been approved, marking a transformative step toward ensuring a reliable and sustainable water supply for Longreach and the surrounding areas.

This ambitious project will see the complete rebuilding and raising of the town's five weirs by one metre, with the addition of fish passages to support local ecosystems. New water mains will be installed, and household smart meters will be introduced, all aimed at enhancing water efficiency across the region. These improvements are expected to increase our water storage capacity by 900 megalitres and reduce water loss by 245 megalitres each year.

The project is made possible through a collaborative funding effort, with \$5 million contributed by the Australian Government through the National Water Grid Investment Fund, \$7 million from the Queensland Government, and \$6.6 million over two years from Council's capital program.

The Longreach Water Security for Growth project is about much more than infrastructure; it represents a critical investment in the future of our community. By securing a stable and increased water supply, we are improving the quality of life for our residents,

supporting the growth of local industries, and enhancing the appeal of Longreach as a destination for visitors.

Furthermore, the project will provide a welcome economic boost to our region.

Construction is slated to begin in the 2024-25 financial year pending regulatory approval, with careful planning to ensure minimal disruption during the summer wet season. We are committed to keeping the community informed as the project progresses and will provide regular updates on its development.

Mayor Tony Rayner expressed his deep appreciation for the support from both the Australian and Queensland

Governments, highlighting the vital role this investment will play in the future of Longreach.

"The project will not only increase water storage but also improve efficiency across our water network, ensuring a reliable supply for our growing population and thriving tourism industry.

"This project is a testament to what can be achieved when all levels of government work together towards a common goal. We look forward to the positive impact this investment will have on our community for years to come."

Council was thrilled this month to be able to announce an \$18.6 million water infrastructure upgrade under the Water Infrastructure for Sustainable and Efficient Regions (WISER) initiative! This vital project, supported by the Australian and Queensland Governments, will secure Longreach's water future and enhance liveability for our community. As part of the project we're rebuilding and raising the town's five weirs by one metre, adding 900 megalitres of storage, and installing new water mains and household smart meters reducing water loss by 245 megalitres per year.

This project, set to begin this financial year subject to regulatory approval, will create local jobs and futureproof our water supply, ensuring Longreach continues to thrive for residents, industries, and visitors alike. A big thank you to our team and all of our funding partners for their support in making this happen.

It's always pleasing when we announce a program and it becomes oversubscribed – it's a great problem to have! The response to our Active Women and Girls program, which was announced this month, has been overwhelming. It's for women aged 14 and above, beginners through to the experienced athlete, and is completely free. It will run from the start of September through to the end of November 2024, with a recap in February 2025. Officers are working on how to extend the program given the unprecedented demand, but it looks like some late respondents will unfortunately miss out.

Our Seniors Month program was also a hit this month. A big thank you to all the seniors who joined us for morning tea in Isisford park with fresh pancakes. Our seniors enjoyed a morning tea in Longreach with our littlest citizens at the Childcare Centre, a morning of craft activities at the Longreach Arts and Crafts Centre, and a game of Bingo and lunch at the Ilfracombe Recreation Centre. Seniors month is always well supported, and it was great to see a variety of activities in this year's program.

I am always humbled in the presence of our Vietnam Veterans, and I thank all the community members who attended Vietnam Veterans Day this month and showed their support. A big thank you to the RSL sub-branch for the arranging the commemoration in Edkins Park.

# Projects in FOCUS

#### ♦ Tallundilly Creek Floodway

The Longreach & Isisford Concrete crews are installing a new concrete floodway structure at Tallundilly Creek, Isisford. This project falls under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA).



#### Longreach Squash Court Facility

The Longreach Squash Court Facility is receiving a facelift. The project includes a brand-new clubhouse, accessible toilets, a modern kitchen, and a fantastic new deck.

The facility will be closed to the public during the renovation period, which is expected to last a few months. The project is supported by the Minor Infrastructure Program.



#### Galah Street Kerb replacement

The work on Galah Street for kerb replacement, pave and seal has started beginning of August. The team is currently in the process of excavating the kerb in preparation for the road base. The project is Government funded through the Transport Infrastructure Development Scheme (TIDS).





## **Emergency Service Card**

All rural properties in the Longreach Region should have received a letter from us with a blank emergency services card.

This is to assist Council in its disaster preparations and maintaining the capacity to support local communities including the grazing industry. We are intending to build up a database of local knowledge which will aid Council's situational awareness in a disaster.

Some of the possible natural disaster events which could impact the community include flooding, severe storms, bushfires, animal disease outbreaks and pandemics.
