- ♦ Adopted some minor amendments to the Standing Orders Policy
- Approved a siting variation for the construction of a shed, and a Development Permit for the Reconfiguration of a Lot

♦ Eagle Street Beautification

On top of their day-to-day maintenance, our Parks and Gardens team have been busy adding more plants along Eagle street. This is a continuous process as we look to increase the natural greenery around our already beautiful region.

♦ New Ilfracombe Multipurpose Court

Request for tender is now underway for a new multipurpose court (tennis, netball, basketball) at the Recreation Centre in Ilfracombe. The court will be fully shaded and will turn the Recreation Centre into the sporting hub of Ilfracombe. The project is supported by the federal Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

Longreach Skate Park

The retaining wall at the skate park has recently been given an upgrade to improve the accessibility for users. Fencing will be removed once the newly laid turf has settled.

Re-sheet Ilfracombe Aramac Road

The Longreach Construction Crew is re-sheeting the gravel on the Ilfracombe Aramac Road. This project is funded under the Main Roads Gravel Re-Sheet Program.



Kerb, channel and pavement rehabilitation project Isisford

The Isisford Construction Crew is working on the kerb, channel and pavement rehabilitation project in St Mary Street. The work is funded through the TIDS program.



Community Forums

In September Councillors and staff visited each community for bi-annual community forums.

At the forums Council outlined its strategic framework, planning, and changes in the organisational structure. The three directors from Finance, Works, and Communities shared



updates about their respective departments, and the meeting also received an update on budgeted projects for the financial year.
